

and highways in Baltimore County, and recommend the same to the County Commissioners of Baltimore County, who, if they approve the same, are authorized to accept and adopt it as a general plan for the location of streets, and ways in said territory, and no avenues, streets, alleys, roads or ways in Baltimore County within three miles of the boundary line of Baltimore City, shall hereafter be opened, established or condemned, nor shall the dedication of the same be adopted unless the plans of said avenues, streets, alleys, roads and/or ways, including the alignment, established grade, proposed disposition of storm-water drainage and the kind of material and class of construction shall have been first approved in writing by the said Roads Engineer of Baltimore County, or unless the same shall conform to the general plan and grades of streets, alleys, and ways which may be adopted for said territory by the County Commissioners of Baltimore County, or as any plan so adopted may be amended; and, further, no sanitary sewer, storm-water sewer and/or water pipes shall be installed in any avenue, street, alley, road, way and/or elsewhere in Baltimore County, unless such proposed installation, including the character of material to be used and especially the size of sanitary sewer pipes, storm-water sewer pipes and water pipes shall have been first approved in writing by the said Roads Engineer and/or the Chief Sanitary Engineer of the Baltimore County Metropolitan District, as the County Commissioners of said County may direct.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect on and after June 1, 1937.

#### CHAPTER 140.

AN ACT to add two new sections to Article 16 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Montgomery County", sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District", said new sections to be known as Sections 990B and 990C and to follow immediately after Section 990A of said Article, as said section was enacted by Chapter 597 of the Acts of 1935, adding two additional areas to said District, and to add a new section to Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Prince George's County", sub-title "Washington Suburban Sanitary District", said new section to be known as Section 1014A and to follow immediately after
