

for the entire district; in the eighth \$2 per day, not to exceed \$300 for the district; in the fourth district \$2 per day, not to exceed \$300; in the 2nd, 5th, 6th, 7th, 10th and 11th, districts, \$2 per day, not to exceed \$200 for either district."

Which were adopted.

The bill as amended was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to add new Sections to Article 10, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Attachments," and to be sub-title "Claimants of Property,"
