The bill entitled an Act to repeal Sections 1 and 2 of subchapter 2, Sec. 6 of sub-chapter 3, Secs. 1 and 5 of sub-ch.
4, and Sec. 2 of sub ch. 10 of ch. 377 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1870, entitled an Act to repeal an Act passed at the January Session, 1868, entitled "Public Education," providing a general system of Free Public Schools for the State of Maryland, and to repeal all laws inconsistent therewith, and to re-enact the same with amendments, as amended by ch. 463 of the Acts passed at the January Session, 1874, and to substitute other Sections in lieu of those repealed, and to add new Sections to sub-ch. 4 of said first named Act, to be numbered 10 and 11.
