

And the bill, as amended, was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to add an additional Section to be numbered 220, to Article 26, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Corporations," as re-enacted by an Act passed at the January Session, 1868, chapter 471,
