The bill entitled an Act to add an additional Section to Article 26 of the Code of Public General Laws, as amended and passed at the January Session, of 1868, chapter 471.

The bill entitled an Act to remove all gates from the public roads of Charles county.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the Commissioners of Oxford, in Talbot county, to convey to the Board of County School Commissioners of Talbot county a portion of a vacant public lot in the Town of Oxford for the purpose of erecting thereon a public school house.

Also, the following bills, endorsed: "Reported unfavorably, and the report adopted."

The bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments Article 89 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Slander," to enable married women to maintain actions for words spoken maliciously touching their character or reputation for chastity, and tending to the injury thereof.

The bill entitled an Act to add additional Sections to Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Somerset county," sub-title "Fences," to be known as Section 53, Section 54, Section 55, Section 56 and Section 57.

The bill entitled an Act to add an additional Section to Article 37 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Evidence," to be known as Section 6, A.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 10 of Article 51 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Justices of the Peace," as amended by the Act of 1870, chapter 39, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

The bill entitled an Act to add a Section to Article 69 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Officers," to enable parties injured by tortuous acts of Sheriffs and Constables, to have a remedy against the Officer's bond of such Officers.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 3, of chapter 373, of the Laws of January Session in the year 1867, relating to the appointment of a stenographer for the Orphans' Court of Baltimore city, and to re-enact the same with amendment.

The bill entitled an Act to regulate the liquor traffic and prevent intemperance in Calvert county,
