Leave was granted to the Messrs. Browning, Barnard and Atkinson to introduce a bill to prevent the herding of cattle, by non-residents, in Garrett county.

Leave was granted to the Harford delegation to introduce a bill to authorize the Commissioners of Bel Air, Harford county, to collect and receipt for certain moneys.

On motion of Mr. Baldwin,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill to repeal an Act passed at the Session of 1874, chapter 374, entitled an Act for the better protection of persons and property in Baltimore county.
