Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled an Act to amend Art. 95, of the Code of Public General Laws, by adding an additional Section thereto, relating to usury.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Also,

A bill entitled an Act to provide for the collection and preservation of statistics of crime, and pauperism in the State.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Also, delivered the following message:
