

Sec. 1, line 5, strike out the word "first," and insert "twentieth."

Sec. 2, "And be it enacted, that nothing in this Act should conflict with or repeal any of the provisions of the Act of 1874, chapter 466, relating to Fisheries."

Amend title by striking out the words "Talbot county, and in."
