Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay for paving the bed of the street bounding on the State House circle, and for repairing and improving the pavement around the same.

The proposed amendment was adopted, and the bill as amended, read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to empower the surviving trustees of meeting-house of the Associated Methodist Church, in Centreville, or a majority of them, to convey a certain lot of ground in said town, unto the Trustees of the Methodist Protestant Church at Centreville, in Queen Anne's county, in the State of Maryland,
