Your Committee, however, had no difficulty in deciding from the testimony before them, that the Police Force of Baltimore city, at both of said elections, did their duty thoroughly and fully, and that the Police Commissioners for the city of Baltimore are not only blameless and without reproach for the part they acted therein, but should be commended for their foresight, exertions and determination to preserve untarnished the fair fame of the city over whose police administration they preside.

Your Committee, therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolutions by your Honorable Body.

All of which is respectfully submitted,

Resolved, That the report of the Committee on Elections, on the conduct of the Board of Police Commissioners for the City of Baltimore in their appointment of judges and clerks of election for the late municipal and State elections in that city, be accepted and adopted, that said Committee be discharged from any further consideration of that subject, and that it is the sense of the House of Delegates of Maryland, that the said Police Commissioners for the City of Baltimore discharged their full duty in every respect in reference to said elections.
