M., in the State Library, in the presence of said Committee, and that they report said bid or bids to the Senate and House at one o'clock P. M. of the same day.

And further, that said Committee be requested to report at the same time, the bill asked for by the amendment of Mr. Donaldson, to the order offered by Mr. Snowden, January 5th, 1876.

Which was read.

The question recurring upon the adoption of the amendment, (by unanimous consent,)
