Sec. 1, strike out all of Section after the word "State," line 26, and insert "is hereby directed to pay to the mortgagee, on the warrant of the Comptroller, the proceeds of the loan aforesaid, in such sums as required by the terms of the mortgage, to an amount not exceeding the said sum of one hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars, and upon the Attorney General giving the Board of Public Works a written assurance that the property hereinbefore mentioned is clear of all debts and encumbrances of every nature, kind and description, and that the entire property and appurtenances of said Maryland Asylum for the Insane has been duly and legally conveyed to the State."
