The bill entitled an Act to repeal Sections 1 and 2, of sub-chapter 2, Section 6, of sub-chapter 3, Sections 1 and 5, of sub-chapter 4, and Section 2, of sub-chapter 10, of chapter 377, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1870, entitled an Act to repeal an Act passed at the January Session, 1868, entitled "Public Education," providing a general system of Free Public Schools for the State of Maryland, and to repeal all laws inconsistent therewith, and to re-enact the same with amendments, as amended by chapter 463, of the Acts passed at the January Session, 1874, and to substitute other Sections in lieu of those repealed, and to add new Sections to sub-chapter 4, of said first named Act, to be numbered 10 and 11,

Which was rejected for want of a Constitutional majority, and reconsidered,
