The bill entitled an Act to continue in force the Act of 1872, chapter 420, entitled an Act to re-vive, re-enact and amend certain Sections of the Act of 1852, chapter 316, entitled an Act to authorize the appointment of a Commissioner to take testimony, to provide for the recording of copies of wills and other papers, of which the originals were lost, by the burning of the Court House in Dorchester county, and to remedy as far as practicable the evils likely to ensue from the destruction of the records of said county,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to lay out and established a new Election District in Frederick county, from a portion of
