The bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, chapter 219, of the Acts passed January Session, 1874, which was an Act regulating the right of fishing in the Patuxent River and its Tributaries.

Endorsed: "Reported unfavorably, and report adopted." Also.

The bill entitled an Act to declare the Monday, immediately preceding Tuesday, the Fourth day of July, 1876, a legal holiday.

Endorsed: "Passed by yeas and nays."

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore city to subscribe to the capital stock of the Baltimore, Chesapeake and Delaware Bay Railroad Company, or to endorse the bonds of said Company.

Endorsed: "Passed by yeas and nays."

Mr. Loane, Chairman of the Committee on Corporations, reported favorably,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 119, of chapter 471, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session of 1868, relating to Corporations, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read a second time.

Mr. Robinson, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably,

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel, Prince George's and Calvert counties, to provide free travel over the Patuxent River, at or near Hill's Bridge, and to determine the cost between them.

Which was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 6, of chapter 244, of the Acts of the General Assembly, passed at the January Session, 1872, entitled an Act to authorize the appointment of Weighers of Grain, by the Governor, and to amend and re-enact said Section as amended,
