The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 3, of Article 11, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Attorneys at Law, and Attorneys in Fact," as amended by the Act of Assembly, passed at the January Session, 1872, chapter 91, and re-enact the same with an amendment,

Being upon a third reading.

Mr. Constable submitted the following amendments:
