Mr. Browning, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably, with proposed amendment,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to form a new Election District out of portions of 3rd, 5th and 6th Election Districts of Garrett county.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Strike out in Section 1, line 2, the name of "Joseph Welsh," and insert "William Browning, Sr." strike out "Sections 5 and 6," and make "Section 7." Section 5."

Which was adopted.

And bill, as amended, was read a second time.

Also.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, certain Sections of the Acts of 1872 and 1874, relating to the times for holding the terms of the Circuit Court for Garrett county.
