The bill entitled an Act to repeal the fourth Section of Article 81, of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, as the same was enacted by the Act of January Session, 1874, chapter 483, and to enact a new Section in lieu of the said fourth Section so repealed,

Also, favorably,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to add an additional Section to Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, of the City of Baltimore, sub-title "Taxes and Loans," as sub-Section "873 A."

Which was read a second time.

Also, unfavorably,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to add certain additional Sections to Article 81, of the Code of Public Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Revenue and Taxes," providing for the assessment of property heretofore or hereafter omitted to be assessed, and for the collection of State Taxes payable therein,

The unfavorable report was adopted.
