REPORT.

To the Honorable,

The General Assembly of Maryland :

The undersigned, members of the Committee appointed under the Joint Resolutions of the Senate and House of Delegates, in relation to the Southern Maryland Railroad Company, passed January 25th, 1876, beg leave to submit the following minority report :

The resolutions directed your Committee to make the following specific inquiries :

First. * * * * * Whether the said subscription by the Treasurer of the State to the capital stock of the Southern Maryland Railroad Company was induced to be made by false and fraudulent representations?

Second. Whether the said sum of one hundred and sixty-three thousand dollars, or any part thereof, was induced to be paid by the Treasurer of the State of Maryland to said Southern Maryland Railroad Company by false and fraudulent representations?
