Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary, to introduce a bill to protect citizens of Cecil county, by preventing citizens of other States from fishing in said waters, except under certain restrictions.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Inspections, to introduce a bill to regulate the weighing and inspection of grain.

On motion of Mr. Vandiver,

Leave was granted to the Harford delegation, to introduce a bill to authorize the County Commissioners of Harford county, in their discretion to divide any of the election districts in said county, into election precincts, and designate the places of holding elections therein.

On motion of Mr. Hance,

Leave was granted to the Anne Arundel and Prince George's delegations, to report a bill to repeal and amend and re-enact Section 4, of the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January Session, 1854, chapter 85, entitled an Act to incorporate a Company to erect a bridge over the Patuxent river, between Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties.

On motion of Mr. Loane,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Ways and Means, to introduce a bill to provide for licensing Pawn-brokers.

On motion of Vandiver,

Leave was granted to the Harford delegation, to introduce a bill to protect citizens of Harford county, by preventing citizens of other States from fishing in said waters, except under certain restrictions.
