On motion of Mr. Gwynn,

Leave was granted to the Prince George's delegation, to introduce a bill to repeal Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4, of the Act of January Session, 1872, chapter 436, entitled an Act to regulate the pay of State's Attorney, for Prince George's county.

On motion of Mr. Bird,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary, to introduce a bill entitled an Act, to repeal an Act passed at the January Session, 1874, chapter 231, entitled an Act to regulate the Commissions to be allowed Clerks of Courts, for collecting and paying over to the Treasury, public money.

On motion of Mr. Hance,

Leave was granted to the Prince George's delegation, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to amend the second section of the Act passed at January Session, 1870, chapter 477, under the head "Prince George's county," by adding the name of Mrs. Ryan, widow of Thomas, in the place of Mrs. Prior, widow of Thomas, which is an error in the engrossment of said Act.

On motion of Mr. Boyer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Boyer, Usilton and Rawlings, to introduce a bill to require the School Commissioners for Kent county to organize and lay down a new school district, for colored children, in the first election district of Kent county.

On motion of Mr. Fenton,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Ways and Means, to introduce a bill appropriating a sum of money for the purpose of removing and re-interring the remains of the Maryland Dead of the late Confederate Army.

On motion of Mr. Whitelock,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill to provide for the completion of Wilkins' Avenue, in Baltimore county.

On motion of Mr. Atkinson,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to add a new section to Article 61, of the Code of General Laws, entitled "Mechanic's Lien," to come after Section 53, and be called "Section 54."
