

On motion of Mr. Constable,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to provide against fraudulent voting at elections.

Mr. Loane, Chairman of the Committee on Corporations, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to repeal an Act passed at the Session of 1870, chapter 148, entitled an Act to add additional Sections to the Act of 1865, chapter 36, entitled an Act to incorporate the German Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore, and also to repeal Sections 2, 3 and 6, of the said Act of 1865, chapter 36, entitled an Act to incorporate the German Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore, and to re-enact said 3 Sections with amendments.
