On motion of Mr. Coburn,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the National Lubricating Company of Maryland.

On motion of Mr. Neal,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Neal, Cockey and Dunbar to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 32, of Article 17, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Queen Anne's," sub-title "Centreville," and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to add additional Sections to said Article.

On motion of Mr. Ward,

Leave was granted to the Select Committee on Fisheries to introduce a bill for the protection of fish within the waters of Cecil county, by preventing the hauling of seines within a prescribed time, and except under certain other restrictions.

On motion of Mr. Stewart,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore city delegation to introduce a bill to authorize the Board of Commissioners of Finance, of the City of Baltimore, to protect the credit of the city, and provide against the contingency of the City Council not passing the necessary ordinances for the support of the municipal government, and to meet the just obligations of the city.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill entitled an Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Woodberry Manufacturing Company of Baltimore county.

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to repeal and re-enact with amendments chapter 395, of the Act of the General Assembly of 1874, entitled an Act to authorize the United States to procure the condemnation of lands within the State of Maryland, for certain public purposes, and ceding the jurisdiction thereof, when so condemned, to the United States.
