of the Acts of 1872, entitled an Act to provide for the destruction of hawks and owls, and to protect the class of small birds known as insectiverous birds, in Prince George's, Talbot and Montgomery counties, and to re-enact the same with amendments, so as to exclude Montgomery and Talbot counfies from the provisions of said Section,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to refund to Dennis Cookson, of Carroll county, a certain sum of money erroneously paid into the Treasury,
