I have the honor to inform you that I have approved and signed the following House bills:

No. 11.—An Act authorizing the County Commissioners of Garrett county to levy money for the payment of wolf or other scalps, destroyed within the limits of said county.

No. 12.—An Act to repeal Article 21 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Crows," so far as the same relates to Harford, Frederick, Montgomery, Queen Anne's, Calvert, Prince George's, Garrett, Talbot, Charles, Carroll and Caroline counties.
