A bill entitled an Act to appropriate seven thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purchasing of a suitable lot and the erection thereon of scales, adapted to the weighing of hay, straw and live stock.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bill:

A bill entitled an Act granting additional powers to the Potomac Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

Returned the bill entitled an Act to repeal an Act entitled an Act to require all auctioneers making sales in Baltimore county, to pay a license fee.
