The bill entitled an Act to empower the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to purchase, lease or condemn lands for public parks or squares within the limits of Baltimore city.

Endorsed "passed by yeas and nays."

Joint Resolutions in relation to migratory fish in the waters of the Potomac river.

Which were read a first time.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, (the rules being suspended by unanimous consent.)
