A memorial adopted at the Mass Reform meeting held at the Maryland Institute, in Baltimore city, on the 30th of November, 1875, pursuant to a call signed by William Mac-cubbin and about three thousand other citizens of the State of Maryland and City of Baltimore, demanding that the Legislature shall throw out the vote of Baltimore city at the late election.
