

On motion of Mr. Scott,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 6, of Article 69, of the Code of Public General Laws.

On motion of Mr. Scott,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Militia to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 182, of the Acts of 1870, entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact chapter 414, of the Acts of 1868, entitled "an Act to repeal Article 63, Code of Public General Laws, relating to Militia," and Sections 652 to 770, both inclusive, of Article 4, Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Militia in the City of Baltimore, and to enact a substitute therefor.

Leave was granted to the Baltimore city delegation to introduce a bill repealing Section 804, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Baltimore city," sub-title "Orphans' Court," and re-enacting the same with amendment.

On motion of Mr. Brooke,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to repeal and re-enact with amendments the Act of January Session, 1868, chapter 334, entitled an Act supplementary and amendatory of the Act of 1849, chapter 469, entitled an Act to amend the charter of the Cumberland and Pennsylvania Railroad Company, and to further repeal and amend said last named Act.

On motion of Mr. Naill,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled a further supplement to the Act passed by the General Assembly of Maryland, January Session in the year 1867, chapter 247, entitled an Act to establish and incorporate an Asylum for the Deaf and Dumb of the State of Maryland.
