Ordered, That the Inspector of Tobacco, in Tobacco Warehouse No. 3, report to this house within five days, the name of the Chief Clerk, the Receiving Clerk, the Shipping Clerk, the Weighing Clerk, and the finder, the amount of salary or wages each are entitled to receive for the year 1875, the amount of actual time each have spent in the duties of his position during said year, the amount of time each have been absent during said year, and during said absence, who has attended to the duties of said absentee, and what remuneration said absentee paid for having his duties attended to, and who of said Clerks are acting under oath, and that the Chief Clerk of this House see that this order is served on said Inspector.
