Leave was granted to the Committee on Judiciary, to infroduce a bill to repeal and re-enact as amended, chapter 36, of the Acts of January Session of 1872.

On motion of Mr. Gunby,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill for the better protection of church buildings in this State.

On motion of Mr. Cockey,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to amend Section 43, of Article 61, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Mechanics' Lien," and to re-enact the same with amendment.
