The bill as amended, was then read a second time, and ordered to be engressed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 67, of Article 30, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Publishments," sub-title "Gunning," and to enact a substitute therefor.

Being upon a second reading,

Mr. Donaldson submitted the following amendment:

## AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 67, at end of Section, add the following: "To be paid to the credit of the School Fund for such county."

The bill entitled an Act to repeal the 12th and 13th Sections of Article 75, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Pleading, Practice and Process," sub-title "Pleading," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact Section 2, and to repeal Section 9, of an Act passed at January Session, 1872, chapter 414, entitled an Act to prevent incompetent persons from conducting business as pharmacist, or vending at retail, drugs modicines or chemicals, for medicinal use in the City of Baltimore, and repealing the Act entitled an Act to prevent incompetent persons from conducting the business of Druggist or Apothecary in the City of Baltimore, passed at January Session, 1870, chapter 104, &c.
