On motion of Mr. Hance,

Leave was granted to Calvert, Charles and Prince George's delegation to introduce a bill to repeal, amend and re-enact Section 17 of the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January Session, 1874, chapter 181.

Also,

Leave was granted to the Prince George's delegation to introduce a bill to repeal, amend and re-enact Section 44 of the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January Session, 1872, chapter 294 entitled an Act to repeal Sections 47, 48 and 50 of Article 16 of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Prince George's county," under head of "Collectors" enacted by the Act of 1868, chapter 330, and Sections 44, 45, 49, 55 and 56 of said Article 16, under same head, enacted by the Act of 1870, chapter 216, and to repeal Sections 37, 49, 50, 56 and 57 of Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Revenue and Taxes," in so far as the same may relate to Prince George's county, and to add an additional Section to said Public Local Laws.

Also,

Leave was granted to the Prince George's and Anne Arundel delegation to introduce a bill for the protection of birds in Prince George's and Anne Arundel counties.

The House then proceeded to the consideration of the un-
