Liberty and New Windsor Turnpike Road Company, in Frederick and Carroll counties, to issue its bonds to aid in the construction of its road, and to secure the same by mortgage.

On motion of Mr. Constable,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to
introduce a bill to amend and researct Section 9, Article 3,

of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to fees of officers, and substitute a Section therefor

On motion of Mr. McGlone,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal the Act of 1872, chapter 203, entitled an Act to repeal Section 59 of the Act of 1868, ch. 471, relating to corporations, and to re-enact said Section with amendments, and to repeal the Act of 1872, ch. 325, entitled an Act to repeal Section 59 of the Act of 1868, ch. 471, entitled an Act to repeal Article 26 of the Code of Public General Laws, and to enact a substitute therefor, and to repeal Section 22 of Article 16, Sections 99 to 103 of same Article, and Sections 33 to 43 of Article 88 of the Code of Public General Laws, and re-enact the same, so as to read as follows.
