Ordered, That the Committee on Ways and Means be, and the same is hereby required to report at an early day, a bill for the action of this House, making it unlawful, with suitable penalties, for any public officers of this State to receive for his personal use or advantage, or for the private advantage of any other person, any consideration whatsoever in the way of interest or otherwise, for the deposit or employment of the public money at any time under his control, or to deposit the public moneys in any bank in which the said officer may be interested, either as an officer, director or stockholder.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Hawkins submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the Post Master of this House be required to furnish each member of this House the same amount of postage stamps as were furnished each member at the last session, also the same amount to the Chief Clerk, the Reading Clerk, the Journal Clerk, and the Engrossing Clerks.

Which was read.
