

The House proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments that part of Article 21, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, contained between Sections 314 and 334, both inclusive, title "Washington County," sub-title "Williamsport," and to confirm and make valid the election held in said town of Williamsport, on the first Monday in March, 1875, for Burgess, Assistant Burgess and five Commissioners for said town, and to confirm and make valid the action of the said officers so elected, in appointing a bailiff for said town.

Said bill being upon a second reading,

Said bill was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

And having been engrossed,

Mr. Smith, Speaker, moved that the bill be read a third time this day, under the provisions of the Constitution, Sec. 27, Article 3.
