

1. No child under the age of sixteen years shall be employed in labouring by any person, firm or corporation, in any cotton, woollen or other manufacturing establishment in this State, more than ten hours in any one day."

Which was read.

Mr. Boyle moved that the further consideration of said bill together with pending amendment, be postponed and made the order of the day for to-morrow.

Decided in the negative.

The amendments submitted by Mr. Stewart, were then severally adopted, and the bill as amended, was passed by yeas and nays as follows:
