The bill entitled on Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Frederick county to adjust and settle the account of Wm. R. Dorsey, Register of Voters for Woodville Election District, No. 18, of said county, by paying him such compensation for extra services by him rendered as Register aforesaid, as they may deem right and proper,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
