rights and interest of the State of Maryland, in and to a bequest of two thousand dollars made by the will of said deceased to his wife, Ann Griffith, who died before her said husband, without heirs.

On motion of Mr. Dashiell,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to empower James H. Elliott to settle his guardian account with Lillie M. Hughes.

On motion of Mr. Dodson,

Leave was granted to the Dorchester and Talbot delegations to introduce a bill to incorporate the Talbot County Canal and Navigation Company.

On motion of Mr. Bird,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Inspections to introduce a bill relating to the inspection of tobacco.

On motion of Mr. Whitelock,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill entitled an Act providing for the repeal of Section seventy-eight to ninety, inclusive, of the "Public Local Laws" of Baltimore county, entitled "Treasurer," and to enact other provisions in lieu thereof.
