

The question recurring on the adoption of the amendment.

The bill was then ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal, amend and re-enact Section 4 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January Session, 1854, chapter 85, entitled an Act to incorporate a Company to erect a bridge over the Patuxent river between Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties,
