

On motion of Mr. Naill, it was Ordered, That it be entered upon the daily journal that Mr. Naill and Mr. Riggs voted for the bill to provide a Board of Police Commissioners for Annapolis city, under a misapprehension of the character of the bill, and that if they had understood the nature of its provisions they would have voted against its passage.

Mr. Canby submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the Chairman of the Committee on Claims be authorized to allow Wm. F. Lazenby twenty days per diem for services rendered as Assistant Post Master to the present Session of Legislature, said Lazenby having received no pay for his services as Assistant Post Master in reorganizing this House.

On motion of Mr. Baldwin, (the rules being suspended,) Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill to authorize the Baltimore, Hampden and Towsontown Railway Company to issue an increased amount of bonds.

On motion of Mr. Stewart, it was Ordered, That Mr. Onley be excused from attendance on the sessions of this House for a few days.

On motion of Mr. Chaisty, it was

Ordered, That Mr. Ford be excused from attendance on the sessions of the House on Saturday and Monday next, to enable him to visit his family.

On motion of Mr. Clark, (the rules being suspended,) Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to report a bill incorporating the "Triadelphia Turnpike Company," in Howard and Montgomery counties.

On motion of Mr. Fenton, (the rules being suspended,) Leave was granted to Messrs. Fenton, Hoblitzell and Busk to introduce a bill to repeal Sections 10 and 11, of Article 51, of the Code of Public General Laws, vol. 1, chapter 39, Acts of 1870.

We have received your message asking the return of House bill entitled an Act to repeal Sections 82, 83 and 84, of the
