Leave was granted to the Baltimore City Delegation to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal section nine hundred and forty-one, Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "City of Baltimore."

Also,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore City Delegation to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal and re enact with amendments, Section 935, Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "City of Baltimore."

On motion of Mr. Lambdin,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries, to introduce a bill for boats of ten tons and under, to catch oysters with scoops or dredges, in the waters of the Little Choptank River, as high up as Casews' Shoals.
