Senate bill entitled an Act to enable Francis L. McDonald and Mary Jay Frankland, of England, to take and hold certain lands lying in Charles county, Maryland, which were held by Frederick Dawson, late of said State, in trust for certain parties in said Act named.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 67, of Article 30, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Gunning," and re-enact a sub-title therefor.

Endorsed: "Reported unfavorably from the Committee on Judiciary Proceedings and report adopted."

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to enable the qualified voters of Wicomico county, to determine by ballot whether Spirituous or Fermented Liquors shall be sold in said county.

Endorsed: "Passed by yeas and nays."

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to exempt certain portions of the waters of Anne Arundel county from the operations of Section 1 and 3, Article 98, of the General Laws, title "Wild Fowl," and to re-enact other Sections in lieu thereof.

Endorsed: "Passed by yeas and nays."

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal sub-Section 4, of chapter 425, of the Acts of 1874, entitled "Somerset county," and re-enact the same with amendments.

Endorsed: "Reported unfavorably from the Select Committee and report adopted."

The bill entitled an Act to repeal any supposed exemption of the capital stock of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, or any of its branch roads from taxation,
