

The bill was then sent to the Senate.
The bill entitled an Act to amend Section 51 of Article 3, of the Constitution of Maryland, being under consideration,

Mr. Donaldson moved to amend the proposed amendment, Amend Section 1 by striking out all from the word "concurring," in the second line, to the end of the same Section, and inserting in lieu thereof the following, viz:

The following Section is proposed as an amendment by way of substitute for Section 51, of Article 3, of the Constitution of this State, so that the same may read as follows, to-wit: Section 51. Personal property of residents of the State shall be subject to taxation in the county or city where the resident *bona fide* resides for the greater part of the year for which the tax may or shall be levied, and not elsewhere, except goods and chattels permanently located, which shall be taxed in the city or county where they are so located, and no property of any description, real or personal, in the State of Maryland, shall be exempted by any law or ordinance, only anything therein contained from taxation for State, county or municipal purposes,

The question being upon the adoption of the amendment, The amendment was adopted.

So the bill was read a second time as amended, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, and

On motion of Mr. Donaldson, The bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, Section 5, of Article 93, of the Code of Public General Laws as amended and re-enacted by Act passed at the January Session, 1874, chapter 155.

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 231 of the Acts of 1814, entitled an Act to regulate the commissions to be allowed Clerks of Courts for collecting and paying over to the Treasury public money, and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to regulate the speed of railroad trains while crossing a track or switch on the same grade, Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
