their county scat. The new county would include these people, and thereby settle the county seat question for Garrett county.

In this connection, we would also say, that the new county would embrace almost the entire developing coal lands of Western Maryland within its limits, freed from the antagonistic interests at home, that now beset enterprises calculated to afford more ample and cheaper means of transportation for their products, and be at liberty to aid in the construction of such works as their interests require.

Your memorialists therefore submit it to your impartial judgments to say whether these be not sufficient considerations to justify the people concerned in asking what they do, and you, the guardians of their interests, granting them what they ask.
