Senate bill entitled an Act to provide for making a survey of Allegany and Garrett counties, and taking a vote of the people for or against a new county in certain districts of Allegany and Garrett counties, at the election to be held for members of Congress in the Fall of 1876.

Senate bill entitled an Act for the relief of Mary Ann Disney.

House bill entitled an Act to empower the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to purchase, lease, or condemn lands for Public Parks or Squares within the limits of Baltimore city,
