Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 7, of an Act, entitled an Act to add certain additional Sections, relating to the Superior Court of Baltimore city, to the fourth Article of the Public Local Laws, regulating the return of process, and the taking of judgments in said Courts, passed by the General Assembly of Maryland, at the January Session of 1864, chapter 6, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill entitled an Act, supplementary to an Act, passed at January Session, 1852, entitled an Act to incorporate the Santa Clara Mining Association, of Baltimore, authorizing said Association to make and enforce payment of all calls or assessments upon its capital stock heretofore made or hereafter to be made.
