Mr. Gorman, (by unanimous consent,) obtained leave to make a favorable report from the Select Committee on

Which was read the first time.

Also,

Mr. Aydelotte, (by unanimous consent,) obtained leave to make a favorable report from Select Committee on Boundary Line between the States of Virginia and Maryland, on

Senate bill entitled an Act to provide for the payment of the counsel employed to represent the State in the arbitration between Maryland and Virginia, upon the boundary line between the said States, and to appropriate a sum of money therefor, and for the other expenses of said arbitration.

Which was read the first time,

And,

On motion by Mr. Aydelotte,

Was referred to the Committee on Finance.

The Senate then resumed the consideration of the order of the day.

Mr. Humphreys moved that said bill be referred to the Committee on Finance.

M. Fields, (Mr. Lloyd in the Chair,) moved to adjourn.
