Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce the following bills :

A bill entitled an Act to repeal Sections 13 and 31 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Attachments, and to re enact the same with amendments.

Also,

A bill entitled an Act to add an additional Section to Article 45 of the Code of Public General Laws relating to dower.

Also.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 37 of Article 75 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Pleadings, Practice and Process," sub-title "Practice."

Also,

A bill entitled an Act to amend Article 45 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to husband and wife.

On motion by Mr. Joyce,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal Sections 459, 464, 467, 469, 470 and 475 of the Public Local Laws, entitled "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Live Stock," and re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion by Mr. Humphreys,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance, to introduce a bill to amend Section 5, Article —, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Publication of Laws," passed at Session 1868, chapter 67.

On motion by Mr. Getty,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 5, of the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed January Session, 1874, chapter 144, entitled an Act to repeal Sections 5 and 6, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January Session, 1872, chapter 212, entitled an Act to provide for taking a vote for or against a new county in certain election districts of Allegany county, at the election to be held in the fall of 1872, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
