Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Sections 4 and 6, of chapter 150, of the Acts of 1874, entitled "an Act to establish a Commission of Fisheries of the State of Maryland, define its duties, and to appropriate a sum of money to defray the expenses thereof," and to re-enact the same with amendments.
